Description

Churches in Sweden are almost always white or made of stone. Churches have a tower with a bell that rings once or twice an hour. The church bell rings also on service and ceremonies. Across the church is often a graveyard and a chapel. The altar of the church is almost always to the east.

Position of the object

The church is often situated on a hill or in a place which is a little higher than the rest of the surrounding houses / buildings, because in the past people should be able to hear the churchbells ring anywhere in the village.

Size

The church is 48 meters long, 19,5 m wide and 32 m high.

Materials

It's made of stone.

Date of building/ epoch:

Construction started out in 1829 and the building was completed in 1837.

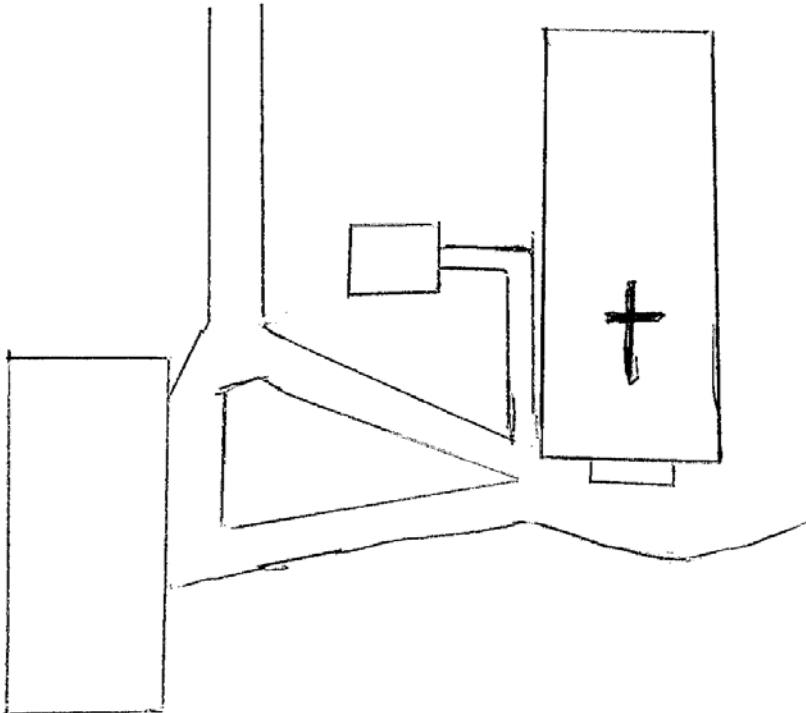
Architect/ artist:

There is no information regarding this.

Renovation, restoration (when, by whom, who paid, why?):

In 1826 permission was granted to build Gamleby Church. King Carl XIV Johan was the one that gave the permission. The church was renovated in 1970. The old church was abandoned and deteriorated and was bought by wholesale dealer Cornelius in 1860. Later the building was torn down.

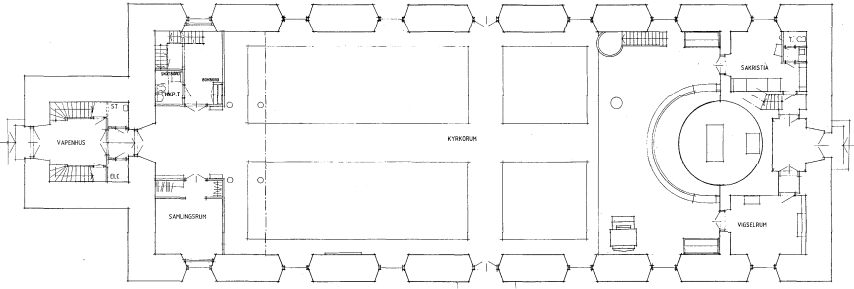
Sketch plan:

	Organ	<p>This is a photograph of an organ. All Swedish churches have got one of them each and they are like huge pianos and sound very loud. You use an organ at funerals, weddings and for accompanying the singing of psalms.</p>
	Picture	<p>This is an picture of Jesus who is highly placed on the cross and the girls who are beside him mourn him.</p> <p>On the picture beneath there are two religions who mourn Jesus death.</p>
	Pulpit	<p>What you see on this photograph is the Swedish pulpit where the priest stands and preaches to the people about how to live their lives according to the Christian belief. Most people think it's boring.</p>
	Bowl	<p>This is a picture of a bowl. In this bowl you put holy water when you are going to baptize a human. It's often a child who gets baptized but it's possible to get baptized in all ages. To get confirmed you need to be baptized in Sweden.</p>
